COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

"Introduction to Recipient Rights" (Self-study – available on-line or book format) This course provides an orientation to and an overview of the legal rights guaranteed to recipients of community mental health services.

"Rights of Individuals Receiving Mental Health Services" (Virtual and In-Person training): These courses are presented in a lecture and interactive format and provide comprehensive training to help providers understand their obligations to promote and protect the civil and treatment/support rights of recipients guaranteed by law, including Civil Rights, Freedom from Abuse and Neglect, Confidentiality, Services Suited to Condition, Informed Consent, Person-Centered Planning/Family-Centered Practice, Individual Plan of Services, Rights of Residents of Facilities, and the Rights Protection System (Reporting Requirements, Complaint, Investigation, and Appeal).
